* A Community Interest Company (CIC) is a special type of limited company in the UK designed to benefit the community rather than private shareholders. Unlike traditional businesses focused on profit, CICs are primarily established to achieve a social or environmental mission. They operate like other companies, but with additional requirements to ensure their activities truly benefit the community

Providing expertise, advice, and support to enable communitybased organizations to plan and implement sustainability projects




Enabling access to project funding through grants, community shares, and bequests to execute sustainability projects

For example, a community solar initiative could be a solar energy collective buying scheme where residents in a street or neighbourhood decide that they will all get rooftop solar panels, and club together to get a better deal from installers
